

What is OYAP?

An OYAP student is a student who is earning cooperative education credits for work experience in an apprenticeship occupation. The student may or may not be formally registered as an apprentice while attending secondary school.

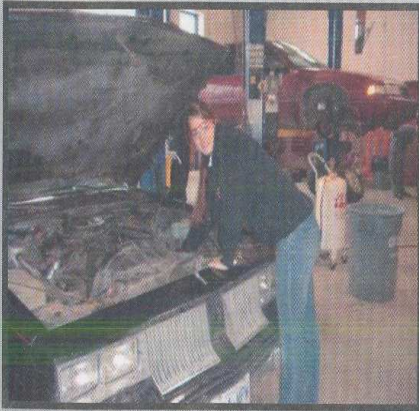
Who can participate in OYAP?

All students participating in OYAP must:

- have completed sixteen credits towards the OSSD prior to starting the program;
- be enrolled as full-time students during the program;
- be working towards the completion of all OSSD requirements.

How do you apply for OYAP?

OYAP is a form of Co-op. Applications for Co-op are available through your Guidance Department. You must meet all the normal requirements for the Co-op program (i.e. you must have earned a credit in a related secondary school course). Interested students should talk to their Guidance Counsellor.

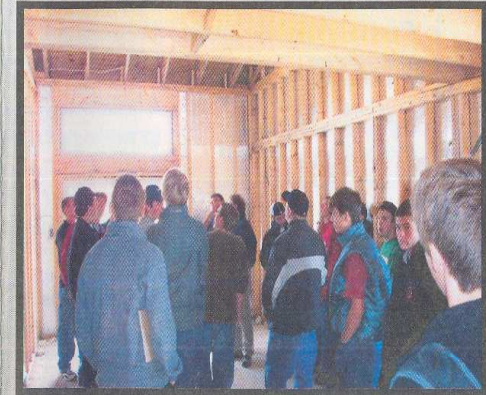

What is Co-op?

Cooperative Education allows students to "try on" a potential career choice by going to work for part of the school day. Typical Co-op programs have students working two periods a day. Each student has a personalized placement learning plan (PPLP) which provides the framework for this learning opportunity.

While students spend most of their time at the work placement, they do complete an in-school pre-placement session and participate in integration days throughout the semester. Co-op courses must be based on a related course (eg. transportation co-op would require a senior transportation course).



What is Apprenticeship?

Apprenticeship is a post-secondary education opportunity. An employer uses training standards provided by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities (MTCU) to ensure that an apprentice becomes competent. On-the-job training comprises about 90% of the apprenticeship learning. All apprentices attend in-school sessions, usually offered at Community Colleges. Once both the in-school and on-the-job educational components have been satisfied, apprentices must successfully write examinations in order to receive a Certificate of Qualification. The following time line represents a typical apprenticeship.

TQAA Trades Qualification Apprenticeship Act

- ◆ Regulates Construction sector only (some exceptions).
- ◆ Must be a minimum of 16 years old.
- ◆ Minimum of Grade 10 required (Grade 8 for Brick & Stone Mason, Cement Mason and Drywall Finisher & Plasterer).
- ◆ Training is 90% on-the-job and 10% in-school.
- ◆ The TQAA makes certain trades compulsory, meaning that only an apprentice or a certified journeyman may practice that trade. While students are earning cooperative education credits as part of OYAP they are exempt from this rule. However, if students are working outside the hours specified in their Work Education Agreements, they must be registered apprentices.
- ◆ Voluntary trades may be practised without registering as an apprentice.

RED SEAL PROGRAM

The Red Seal or Interprovincial Standards Program allows for greater mobility of skilled workers across Canada. Currently there are 41 "Red Seal" trades. For more information on the Red Seal Program, visit:

Note: The trades listed on this chart are currently either ACA or TQAA Director Approved Programs. Additional apprenticeships referred to as employer specific or modular apprenticeships are also available. ACA Apprenticeship Certification Act

- ◆ Regulates Agricultural, Industrial, Motive Power & Service sectors.
- ◆ Must be a minimum of 16 years old.
- ◆ Minimum of Grade 12 required (Grade 10 for Assistant Cook Br.1, Autobody Repairer Br.2 and Construction Craft Worker).
- ◆ Training is 90% on-the-job and 10% in-school.
- ◆ Restricted trades have restricted skill sets which may be practised only by certified journeymen or registered apprentices. OYAP students may not perform any restricted skill set unless they become registered apprentices. If they do not register, their learning plans must not include any restricted skill sets.
- ◆ Unrestricted trades and skill sets may be practised without registering as an
