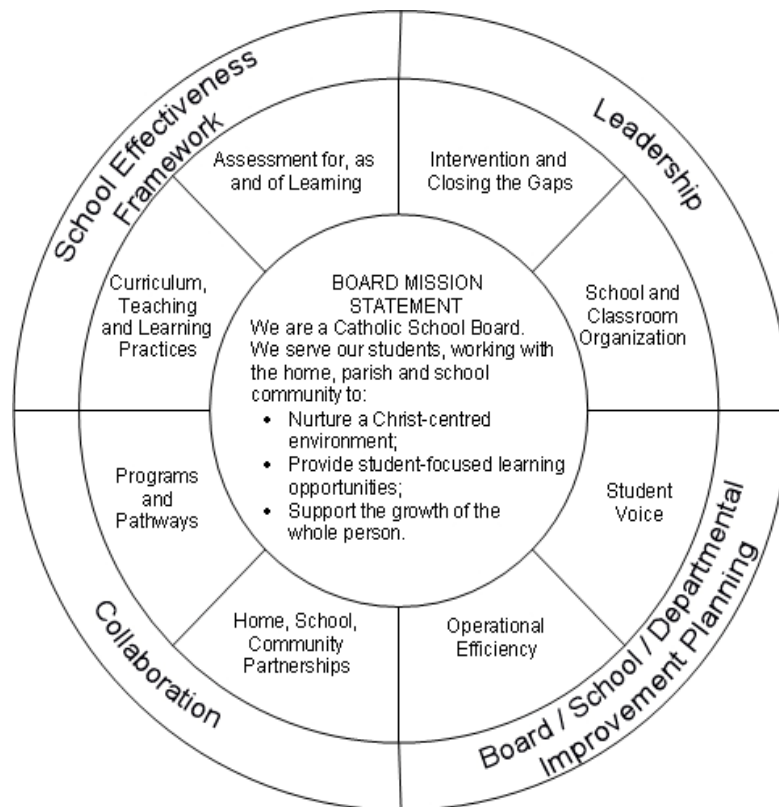
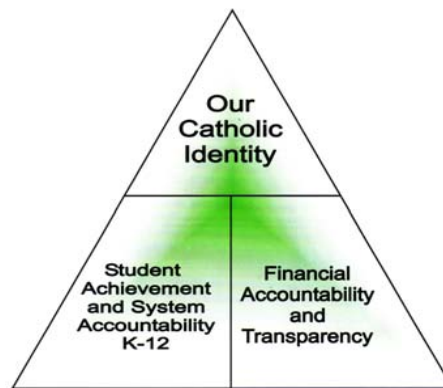


Our Catholic Identity

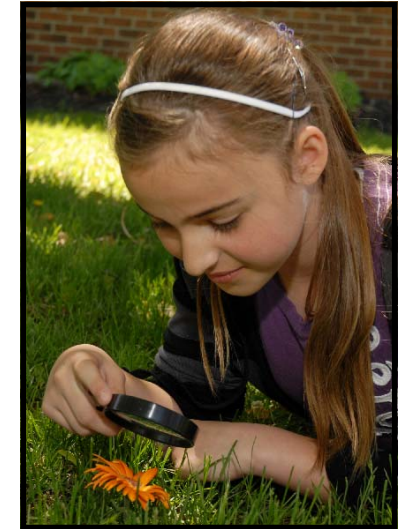
